"Pastor Matthew's Musings

"Do all the good you can, by all the means you can, in all the ways you can, in all the place you can, at all the times you can, to all the people you can,

as long as ever you can." – John Wesley

Now, how does that classic 1980s song go... O yes, "The Heat is On!" Ok, well maybe we have not had a 100 degrees scorcher yet but being someone who sweats nonstop from May to September, I am feeling the summer, and I celebrate it for you all! Now, as summer's heat exhausts, we remember a greater heat that comes from the Holy Spirit that is inside each member of Bellport UMC. As we look back over the past months, we see our faith journey. First, we were Lenten pilgrims, seeking deeper holiness. Then, we were Easter people, celebrating the new creations in us all. Now, we live in the time of Pentecost where we must live the call of Christ- now more than ever in our world. This time of year, reminds us deeply that our faith is very much an action.

NY Annual Conference, 2025 – Observations & Experience

Greetings, Siblings in Christ. While I had attended my first NYAC last year, I was not a voting member (I had checked the wrong box on the registration form!) and was just “learning the ropes” and immersing myself in the process. This year was quite different, with my full participation and somewhat-full understanding of what was going on.

Additionally, we started Thursday night with an event I will share momentarily. The Conference this year ran from June 5th through Sunday morning June 8th.

I had originally thought to keep a straight journal about the long weekend; however, as the Conference went on, I decided instead just to offer you all some of the things that struck me or gave me pause. They may or may not be in order, and I will be glad to answer any (unanswered) questions you might have going forward. I was there to serve and report back to all of you.

Right off the bat: if you have never heard Bishop Bickerton speak, you are missing out on one of the most powerful speakers I have ever heard. His words are always thought-provoking and spiritually challenging.

Additionally, our Conference Lay Director, Gail Douglas-Boykin, is extraordinary, passionate, and a true servant leader – the phrase that kept floating through my head when she spoke was “she is so *cool!*” We are truly gifted to have both of them.

Thursday evening was a very affirming Laity session – for the first half hour, at least.

(Clergy had had their own session a few hours earlier). The remaining time was a presentation on using Artificial Intelligence for good in the church. I must tell you – and this is an example of my own suspect thinking – that all I could think about during

this presentation was Skynet in the first two Terminator movies. But it also triggered lines of thinking about how God wants us to use our minds and hearts for God’s glory. I guess more will be revealed...

Friday morning through Saturday night was Conference business, interspersed with a lot of worship and singing! The theme of this year’s Conference was “Hope with Joy,” and the items we discussed and voted on reflected that theme. For those interested in the details, I will be glad to forward you the pre-Conference booklet in .pdf form (all 232 pages of it). If you can get past the length, it is quite interesting and well done – I mean that sincerely. I don’t think it is restricted to Conference members, and one of the things that was stressed over the weekend was transparency.

Here is a bit of “stream of consciousness” for your consideration:

- Gail D-B warned against “being so busy pouring out for others that we don’t have time to let God pour into us.”
- On a videotape of interviews with retired pastors, one talked about “what the seminary doesn’t prepare you for in ministry.” I will share about that on June 29th – it was staggering.
- In his State of the Church message on Saturday morning, the Bishop... well, he said a *lot* of powerful things, many of which I will also relay on June 29th, but I want to stress our new mission statement, found at <https://www.resourceumc.org/en/umc-resources/vision-of-the-umc>. To summarize it: “Love Boldly... Serve Joyfully... Lead Courageously.”

- Other things I heard on Saturday morning: “it’s not my church, it’s God’s church;” “collaboration, cooperation, communication;” “What does it mean to be the church in 2025? *The current model isn’t working;*” and “could this be our moment, our time?”

We had some challenges. The meal plan at the hotel was a mess on Saturday. Being a stodgy old curmudgeon, I would have liked to have seen more familiarity with Roberts Rules of Order in the legislative sessions (but Pastor Matthew explained what that was about at Bible study – thank you, Pastor!). We had some younger people, but church participation by the newer generations will take some more prayerful discernment and action! I was glad I attended this year. We, as a church and as Christians, have some serious work to do...




