Accomplishments for 2024

Bellport United Methodist Men are closing in on a full year of reawakening. Bellport UMM restarted in September of 2023 after the Covid pandemic shut things down. 2024 has been a full year for us. UMM has initiated several projects to benefit the church property and activities including:

- 1. Organizing a bush and tree pruning effort after getting a \$2,500 estimate from a service company.
- Organized a cleanup and repair service day of the yard and shrubs at the Bellport UMC parsonage.
 - 3. UMM provided a Spaghetti Father's Day Dinner for the congregation. 24 adults and 4 children enjoyed the meal.
- 4. Organized a December "Tom Sawyer day" to rake the leaves to the curb for pickup. This defers \$1,500 expense.
- 5. Supported candy making and other efforts for the December Craft Fair.
 - 6. We worked with the September Harvest Fair to secure a food truck.


